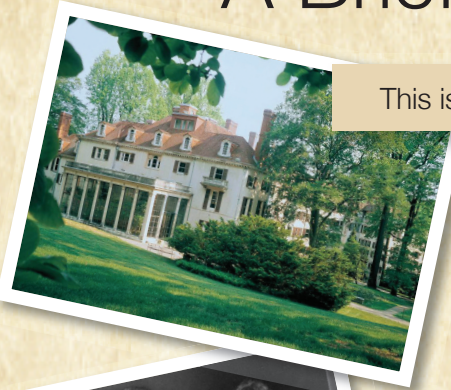


A Brief History of Winterthur
