Winterthur is the living vision of collector and horticulturist Henry Francis du Pont (1880–1969), who opened his beloved childhood home to the public in 1951. Regarded as one of **America's most beautiful historic homes and mansions**—on par with Biltmore Estate, The Breakers, Monticello, and Hearst Castle—visitors from around the world marvel at du Pont's elegantly furnished home in which he entertained his family and friends in grand country-house style. Nestled in the heart of Delaware's beautiful Brandywine Valley, **Winterthur is an American Treasure** and one of the few surviving great American Country Estates.

Tour H. F. du Pont's 175-room former home and marvel at his astounding collection of more than 90,000 antiques displayed in stunning interiors. 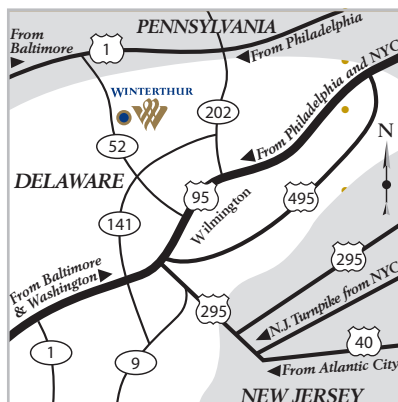

Winterthur is located on Route 52, six miles northwest of Wilmington, Delaware, I-95 (Exit 7), and less than one hour south of Philadelphia. - A 45-minute Introductory Tour of Henry Francis du Pont’s former home*
- The Winterthur Garden
- A narrated Garden Tram Tour. Garden trams run March through December, weather permitting.
- Admission to the Winterthur Galleries and special exhibitions, including the Campbell Collection of Soup Tureens
- Enchanted Woods children’s garden
- Access to early Museum Stores shopping, plus customized tours and lectures (upon request)

* Yuletide at Winterthur includes all of the above, although a one-hour Yuletide house tour replaces the Introductory Tour (from mid-November through early January).
