

WINTERTHUR WILL CLOSE FOR THE SEASON JANUARY 4, 2016, AND REOPEN MARCH 1, 2016

Spring Reopening Will Feature Landmark Pan-American Exhibition and Glorious Garden Blooms

WINTERTHUR, DELAWARE—Winterthur Museum, Garden & Library will close for the season Monday, January 4, 2016, and reopen to the public Tuesday, March 1, 2016, with a sparkling new lineup of exhibitions, inspiring programming, and brilliant color in the garden.

On March 26, Winterthur will open its doors to the landmark exhibition ***Made in the Americas: The New World Discovers Asia***, currently on view at the Museum of Fine Arts, Boston. Proclaimed “scintillating!” by *The Wall Street Journal*, the exhibition explores both the global reach of Asian goods beginning in the 16th century and the profound influence of Asia on the arts of the colonial Americas. Organized by the Museum of Fine Arts, Boston, it features 85 masterpieces, including exquisite silverwork, textiles, furniture, ceramics, and paintings.

Two additional exhibitions will open at Winterthur in May and September 2016. On May 7, ***Embroidery: The Language of Art*** will offer exquisite works that explore the connection between art and embroidery over four centuries. A needlework conference will be held October 14 - 15. In the fall, the exhibition ***Lasting Impressions: The Artists of Currier & Ives*** will open September 17 and be on view through January 8, 2017.

In early spring, bright white snowdrops and yellow adonis and aconite blossoms light up Winterthur’s March Bank while lavender Crocus tomasinianus or “Tommies” and blue glory-of-the-snow seasonally blanket the East Terrace lawn. As spring unfolds, these and other blooms create a spectacular palette of color in the garden.

Winterthur Members will have access to the grounds and garden during the seasonal closing, weather permitting. The Winterthur Library will continue to provide service to scholars and researchers.
